# INTRODUCTION

The Longines EEF Series enters its fifth year in 2025, touring Europe in regional qualifiers before two semi-finals will determine the 10 teams for the Final.

The Longines EEF Series stands as Europe's key Nations Cup competition for developing show jumping talent. Operating at the 3\* and 4\* levels, it serves as the primary pathway for developing combinations, focusing on growing the breadth and depth of talent from all European nations to reach top-level competition.

Teams compete over two rounds on identical courses under Table A against the clock format. Each team fields four riders per round, with the three best scores counting toward the team total. In case of a tie after both rounds, one rider per team contests a jump-off to determine the winning team.

This series has proven instrumental in expanding the sport's competitive base while maintaining high technical standards. Through consistent exposure to team competition formats and quality events, the Longines EEF Series fulfills its mission of cultivating next-generation talent for international jumping.

# LONGINES EEF SERIES HISTORY

## 2021 - 2025

Now in its fifth year, the Longines EEF Series has firmly established itself as a cornerstone of European team Jumping. Born out of a vision to strengthen the sport's foundation across the continent, the Series was launched in 2020 by the European Equestrian Federation (EEF) in collaboration with Longines, with the aim of creating a high-level, accessible competition that would serve as a stepping stone between national shows and elite international events.

From its inception, the Longines EEF Series has embodied the EEF's commitment to inclusivity, development, and sporting excellence. Structured around a regional qualifying system, the Series allows nations to compete within geographic zones, ensuring fair competition and broad participation. The best teams from each region advance to the semi-finals and, ultimately, to a prestigious Series Final, where emerging nations compete alongside more experienced federations in a true celebration of European talent and unity.

The inaugural season in 2020 was impacted by the global pandemic, but the concept proved both resilient and timely. By 2021, the Series was fully underway, offering riders a meaningful team competition experience at CSIO3\* level, where national pride and team strategy come to the fore. Since then, the Longines EEF Series has continued to grow in stature and importance, acting as a vital proving ground for future championship athletes and an accessible arena for nations building their international Jumping programs.

Over the past five years, the Series has seen memorable victories, emotional breakthroughs, and rising stars emerge. It has also provided valuable leadership opportunities for chefs d'équipe and vital international exposure for horses and riders developing toward European Championships, Nations Cups, and even Olympic selection.

For the European community, the Longines EEF Series is more than just a competition. It is a strategic investment in the future of Jumping, offering opportunity, visibility, and cohesion to all 42 national federations within the EEF. As it enters its fifth season, the Series stands as a proud symbol of collaboration, excellence, and the enduring strength of European equestrian sport.



# LONGINES

The partnership between Longines and the European Equestrian Federation, which started in 2015, contributes to developing the sport across the continent, while strengthening the watchmaker's long-lasting commitment to the equestrian world.

Longines' passion for equestrian sports started in the early years following the brand's inception in the 19th century. It all began in 1869 when Longines produced its first pocket watch with an equestrian motif. Longines' name soon became associated with sports timekeeping. Based in Saint-Imier, Switzerland since 1832, Longines watchmakers enjoy expertise steeped in tradition, elegance, and performance. With generations of experience as an official timekeeper for world championships and partner of international sports federations, Longines has created strong relationships in the sports world. Known for the elegance of its timepieces, Longines is a member of Swatch group Ltd., with its winged hourglass emblem established in over 150 countries.



# JUMPING

Jumping is the best known and arguably most universally appreciated of the recognised equestrian FEI disciplines and is one of the three Olympic equestrian sports, alongside Dressage and Eventing. As in all equestrian disciplines, Jumping is unique in offering a level playing field where men and women compete on equal terms in both individual and team events.

A thrilling blend of athleticism, precision and partnership, Jumping sees horse and rider navigate a course of 10 to 13 knockable obstacles, some set as double or triple combinations, with 4 penalties given for each fault. With its emphasis on speed, technique and mutual trust, Jumping has long captured the imagination of audiences worldwide and remains a cornerstone of elite equestrian sport.

Europe has played a defining role in shaping the legacy of Jumping. It was in 1957, at Rotterdam in the Netherlands, that the very first European Jumping Championships were staged – a landmark moment that laid the foundation for what would become a prestigious and fiercely contested title.

At the heart of today's European Jumping landscape is the Longines EEF Series, a unique and strategically important team competition developed by the European Equestrian Federation. Created to strengthen the grassroots and regional foundations of the sport, the Series offers nations across Europe a valuable platform for development and high-level competition. With its regional qualification system leading to a thrilling final, the Longines EEF Series plays a vital role in supporting emerging athletes, broadening participation, and building national teams.

For many riders and federations, the Series is not only a pathway to international success but a symbol of unity, opportunity, and collaboration across the continent. It reflects the EEF's mission to nurture talent, promote accessibility, and foster excellence from the ground up, ensuring that the strength of European Jumping continues to grow from its roots to the very top of the sport.

The European Equestrian Federation proudly upholds this legacy, championing the values and ambitions of the European Jumping community. Through continental championships, grassroots initiatives, and the continued evolution of the Longines EEF Series, Europe remains a global leader in equestrian sport, where courage, grace, and partnership know no borders.



# JUMPING

## DIFFERENT TYPES OF OBSTACLES

Riders are faced with a variety of jumps and obstacles and are most commonly made up of poles or planks suspended by standards on either side. The direction of the course is indicated by flags located on either side of the obstacle (a red flag on the right and a white flag on the left). The order number of the obstacle is indicated at the foot of the obstacle.

The course consists of a variety of obstacles, including fences, walls, oxers, verticals, and combinations.

### 1. Vertical obstacles

A vertical jump consists of a single pole/fence suspended by a jump standard on either side, testing the horse's ability to clear a straightforward obstacle. The horse must rise above the obstacle by raising its shoulders strongly. The obstacles at the Olympic Games measure 1m60 to 1m65 in height, the biggest for international competitions.

### 2. Oxer obstacles

An oxer consists of two or more sets of vertical jumps placed parallel to each other that are jumped in a single effort. Because two verticals are being jumped in one effort, the width of the jump is greater than that of a singular vertical, creating a spread. The horse must approach them with enough momentum to be able to "clear" them, across the width. At the Olympics, they can exceed 2 meters wide.

### 3. Water obstacles

There are two types of water obstacles used which can be either an open water jump, where the horse jumps a shallow pool of water or an obstacle built using a tray of water that must be cleared by the horse

Water Jump: A water jump, or open water jump, typically consists of a shallow pool or water feature that the horse must jump over. These jumps focus on the distance rather than the height of the jump. If a foot lands in the water jump, four faults are incurred.

Liverpool: A Liverpool jump is similar to a water jump, however, it is typically not as wide and has a vertical or oxer jump over the water. The horse must clear the jump and water element without knocking any rails.



# COMPETITION FORMAT

The EEF Series Nations Cup competition consists of two rounds, with identical courses. Both rounds are run according to Table A against the clock. Teams field four athletes per round, with the best three scores counting towards the team total. Any teams that are eliminated, disqualified, retired, or withdrawn in the first round are not allowed to take part in the second round.

The qualification process begins with four distinct regions: South, Central, North, and West, each comprising specific member nations. Every region hosts two CSIO3\* Regional Qualifiers (RQs) between April and June.

Region South National Federations: ALB, BIH, BUL, CYP, GRE, ITA, MKD, MLT, ROU, SMR, SRB, TUR, UKR, CRO, MON

Region Central National Federations: AUT, CZE, GER, HUN, LIE, NED, SLO, SUI, SVK

Region North National Federations: DEN, EST, FIN, ISL, ISR, LAT, LTU, NOR, POL, SWE

Region West National Federations: AND, BEL, ESP, FRA, GBR, IRL, LUX, POR

Teams must participate in both RQs within their region to accumulate points, with first place earning 100 points, second place 90 points, and so on down to 30 points for eleventh place and below. Rankings are determined by combining points from both RQs, with tiebreakers decided by performance in the higher-level qualifier or the second RQ if levels are equal.

Placing Points: 1st – 100, 2nd – 90, 3rd – 80, 4th – 70, 5th – 60, 6th – 55, 7th – 50, 8th – 45, 9th – 40, 10th – 35, 11th and beyond – 30

The Semi-Finals, held at **CSIO3\*** level, bring together the top performers from paired regions. Semi-Final 1 features the top five teams from the South and Central regions, while Semi-Final 2 includes the top five teams from the North and West regions. The host nation of a Semi-Final may compete as an eleventh team if not already qualified, and up to two additional non-EEF teams can be invited, though they cannot qualify for the Final. The top five eligible teams from each Semi-Final advance to the Final.

The EEF Series culminates in a **CSIO4\* Final**, featuring the ten qualified teams from the Semi-Finals, with the host nation potentially joining as an eleventh team if they attempted qualification.



# CLASSIFICATION

This regional framework ensures wide participation, supports balanced competition, and strengthens the foundations of team Jumping throughout the continent, aligning with the European Equestrian Federation's mission to foster growth and unity across all levels of the sport.

The Longines EEF Series builds through three rounds. During the regional qualifiers, eligible nations will score points to earn progression to the semi-finals. Europe is split into four regional groups, with two regional qualifiers for each group. Teams earn points according to their classification in the respective RQs in their Region (teams competing in additional events, outside of their region do not score points), using the following point scale.

The points for each team are added together to establish the Region standings and the top 5 teams from each regional group will move forward to the semi-final. At the semi-finals, it's all to play for as the top 5 from each semi-final gain progression to the Final.

# PROGRAMME

The 2025 Longines EEF Series marks the fifth edition of this dynamic and inclusive team competition, bringing together European nations in a celebration of sporting excellence, unity, and development.

The Series unfolds across the continent with eight CSIO3\* Regional Qualifiers between April and June, hosted in key equestrian venues

The top-performing nations advance to the Semi-Finals and the season culminates in the prestigious Longines EEF Series Final to be held for the first time in Avenches (SUI) from 4 - 7 September, where the most promising teams from across Europe will compete for continental honours in a true showcase of emerging talent and national pride.

# REGIONS

The Longines EEF Series is structured around four regional zones: South, Central, North, and West, reflecting the geographical and cultural diversity of the European equestrian community. Each region includes a group of National Federations and hosts two CSIO3\* Regional Qualifiers (RQs) between April and June, providing a competitive and inclusive pathway toward the semi-finals and final.

**Region South** includes nations such as Italy, Greece, Turkey, and Ukraine, drawing from the Mediterranean and Balkan regions.

**Region Central** features strong equestrian countries like Germany, Switzerland, the Netherlands, and Austria.

**Region North** brings together the Nordic and Baltic nations including Sweden, Finland, Estonia, and Poland.

**Region West** is home to some of the sport's powerhouses, encompasses France, Ireland, Spain, and Great Britain.



# LONGINES EEF FINAL 2025

The prestigious Longines EEF Series Final will make its Swiss debut from 4 - 7 September 2025, at the National Equestrian Institute of Avenches (IENA), marking the beginning of a three-year hosting agreement through 2027.

Europe's premier Nations Cup competition for developing show jumping talent will bring together the top 10 teams, determined through eight regional qualifiers and two semi-finals, to compete over two rounds with four athletes per team at the world-class 142-hectare IENA facility.

The event, led by an experienced organising committee including Edwin Smits, Julien Pradervand, and Anthony Darioly, will feature nearly 300 horses and 100 elite international athletes, with free entry for spectators and comprehensive live broadcasting through [\*\*ClipMyHorse.TV\*\*](https://www.clipmyhorse.tv)

Switzerland's central European location provides optimal accessibility for all participating nations, while the venue's exceptional facilities offer an ideal showcase for both the country's rich equestrian tradition and IENA's unique format to an international audience.






